The Isolation Economy



A nation in isolation is coming together – Britain's community spirit has doubled down as 10 million people have volunteered during the national lockdown. This renewed spirit also includes extending financial support to local businesses - Britons have spent up to £1bn on services they have been unable to use since $23^{\rm rd}$ March, to support low wage workers and help small businesses survive.
