
## UK City and Regional Deals – Local priorities for economic growth

Localism is identified as a key driver in securing the most impactful regeneration in levelling up communities and spreading prosperity. The government has recognised the significant role of local and regional government in setting local priorities and coordinating investments. For this reason, the UK has seen a growing number of city and regional deals which has included the Northern Powerhouse, with metro-mayors serving larger conurbations such as Liverpool, Manchester, and Sheffield.

Britain's cities are embarking on the Build Back Better agenda with very different starting points.
